Course content and timetable

How to get there

By Train

The nearest railway station is Didcot Parkway which is accessible on the mainline from London. It is easiest to pick up a taxi from there which is inexpensive, especially if you club together with others arriving by train.

By Car

When you get nearby it is easiest to follow the brown tourist signs to **Project Timescape** which is at The Northmoor Trust.

When you arrive turn into the main grassed car park and walk up the steps. We will be in the building next to the Project Timescape exhibition.

For all carbon counter enthusiasts - If you are happy to stop off and pick people up at Didcot please let us know and we will circulate your contact details to other course members – equally we try to encourage people to car share so again if you are up for this let us know via email and again we will circulate offers.

What to expect and what to bring

All Fieldskills courses involve some practical elements. In the case of first aid this may be just some bending and lifting inside the classroom, in other courses this may involve working outside in rough or even remote terrain. Clients are reminded of the importance of operating within their abilities and informing Fieldskills of any medical or other issues which may affect their active participation.

Clients should also understand that all outdoor activities are potentially hazardous and that they are obligated to agree to abide by safe practice as instructed.

The course is a combination of lecture based teaching and hands on practical sessions. Therefore there will be a substantial outdoor element to the course. Please bring adequate clothing (boots, waterproofs and fleece) and suitable outdoor footwear.

If you have your own compass please bring this for the navigation lectures. All other specialist equipment will be provided.

Terms and Conditions

Payment of the full course fee is required to secure the booking.

In case of client cancellation:

- More than one month prior to the course Fieldskills is able to provide a 50% refund.
